

Do I reside in the 20th Congressional District of the state of Texas?

According to Congressional rules, I can only serve citizens of Texas who currently reside in District 20. If you are not sure in which district you live, the House of Representatives's website can help you figure it out. Just click [here](#) , and enter your Zip+4 code, *e.g.*, 78206-1286. If you're not sure about the +4 for your address, you can learn that by entering your home address at the US Postal Service's website

. If you live in Bexar County, the

can tell you which congressional district you live in, as well as which Texas State District, State Senate District, and several other jurisdictions.

Does my case involve a Federal agency?

As a representative of the Federal government, I have the ability to make inquiries only to Federal agencies. If your case involves state, county, or local government, you should contact the appropriate elected representative.
